## The California Primary

Election Day: Tuesday March 3, 2020 (aka "Super Tuesday")

Deadline to register: Tuesday February 18, 2020

Register or check your voting status: https://registertovote.ca.gov

### Voting in Primaries: State Offices

Most primaries in California are *non-partisan*. It doesn't matter what your party registraton is. You can vote for any candidate of any party for a state office.

This is called a "Top Two" primary as voted into law by Proposition 14 (2010)

### Voting in Primaries: **President**

But Presidential primaries are *partisan*. If you are registered for as a member of a party you can *only vote for candidates from that party*.

If you are registered "No Party Preference" you can vote for a candidate for of a party but only if you **explicitly request** a partisan ballot

You can only request a ballot from these parties: *Democratic*, *American Independent*, *Libertarian*.

# Simple Case: Registered with a party?

### Vote by mail?

You will be sent a partisan ballot. Mail it back.

### Vote at the polls?

You should be given a partisan ballot when you sign in.



When you sign in at the polls **explicitly** request a partisan ballot.

## Complex Case: "No Party Preference", Vote by Mail?

You got sent a postcard from your **county elections officials**, before the vote-by-mail ballots were sent out.

- Got it?: Choose a party, send it back. Verify they got it, by calling the county elections office.
- Didn't get it?: Call your county elections office and request one.
- Can't get one for any reason? Bring your ballot to the polls and exchange it.

#### Bottom Line

**EITHER**: Register with a particular party. You can change your registration online up to Election Day: https://registertovote.ca.gov

**OR**: Explicitly request a party (or "crossover") ballot.

If all else fails: go to the polls. Request a "crossover ballot". If you were sent a ballot you **must bring it with you** and exchange it!
